SYNOPSIS

BOB TREVINO LIKES IT is inspired by the true friendship that writer/director Tracie Laymon found with a stranger in real life while looking for her father online.

Often playing the role of caretaker to people like her father, who should be caring for her, Lily Trevino longs for familial connection. When her father, Robert, finally checks out of her life, Lily looks for him on the internet. She tries to "friend" a man she believes is her father on Facebook. But instead of finding Robert Trevino, she finds Bob Trevino instead.

Bob Trevino works long hours at a construction company to support his wife Jeanie's elaborate scrapbooking habit. The couple has endured a lot in the past decade, and Bob has prioritized his wife's healing to the point of ignoring his feelings and sense of loneliness. When Bob gets an unexpected Facebook message from a stranger named Lily Trevino, he discerns she needs a friend as much as he does.

Lily and Bob's blossoming friendship becomes a vital source of connection and healing for both, holding the power to change each of their lives forever. Winner of an astounding thirteen film festival audience awards, BOB TREVINO LIKES IT retains the optimism that big tech can still provide human connection and that true friendship is a powerful kind of love and perhaps the family we need most in today's world.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Bob Trevino Likes It is inspired by an unexpected friendship I found online with a stranger who shared my father's name when I was searching for my dad on Facebook.

Through nine years of this stranger's small, simple acts of kindness and consistently supportive words like "Happy birthday!" and "Way to go, kiddo!", this new friend changed my life, without even knowing he had. I found this unusual friendship to be healing, and it helped fill a void in my life. I made this film to tell the world how the little things we say can greatly impact the lives of others, even if we never get to see the results.

Coming-of-age and late coming-of-age stories are often about trying to find a place to belong. In **Bob Trevino Likes It**, our hero Lily learns her father's rejection is not about her. She finds her tribe, her own chosen family, and finally, a place to belong with Bob, his wife Jeanie, and her new best friend Daphne. In many ways, this film is about *cycle breaking* and learning to let go of people who continually hurt us to make room for people who *want* to love us. It shows the power even our smallest day-to-day interactions on social media have.

I often hear the statement "everyone has a father" regarding why this film matters and is so universal. I take that further by saying: "Everyone needs a Bob." Having someone in our lives who shows us empathy

and vulnerability should be normal. But when you don't grow up with that, it can seem like a pipe dream. When Lily finally gets the fatherly love she needs from a new friend, it feels huge, even though in a way, it's baseline. My hope with this film is for us all to find beauty and poignant humor in her discovery.

We need these kinds of films in our society right now—the stories that show, despite our differences, we are all capable of seeing and feeling our *shared humanity*. These stories heal us with heart and humor, give us hope, and remind us that we aren't alone. There are people out there right now who *want to love us*.

While making this film, I experienced the power and love of chosen family through the incredible cast and crew. The inner work and healing that accompany these realizations can really change things—on both a micro and macro level. Being able to make the film and provide some love, humanity and laughter is more than I could have hoped for; and now, to continue this experience and share this story with even more audiences is surreal.

ABOUT THE CAST

BARBIE FERREIRA ("Lily Trevino")

Barbie Ferreira's raw talent, charisma, and distinctive voice have established her as one of the most dynamic talents in Hollywood.

Ferreira made her Broadway debut in 2024 and recently completed production on *Cult of Love*, where she stars alongside Shailene Woodley, Zach Quinto, Chris Lowell, and Mare Winningham. This year she takes the lead in the independent film *Bob Trevino Likes It* alongside John Leguizamo, which premiered at SXSW, where it won the Grand Jury prize and Audience Award. Bob Trevino has since won the hearts of audiences nationwide, and continues to dominate the festival circuit. She also stars in Legendary's upcoming horror film *Faces of Death*, a reimagining of the 1980s mondo horror classic, co-starring Dacre Montgomery. Ferreira also appeared opposite Ariana DeBose in the psychological thriller *House of Spoils*, now streaming on Amazon Prime. Previously, she was handpicked by renowned director Jordan Peele to appear in *Nope*, which debuted as the number one film in the country in 2022.

Ferreira first gained prominence with her breakout role as fan-favorite Kat Hernandez in HBO's *Euphoria*, where she captivated audiences with her fearless and nuanced portrayal of a young woman navigating self-discovery. This marked her return to HBO, having previously portrayed Ella in Sarah Jessica Parker's *Divorce*.

Audiences also lauded Ferreira's performance in *Unpregnant*, a sharp-witted coming-of-age story in which she starred alongside Haley Lu Richardson. The Greg Berlanti-produced film, which follows a Missouri teen's journey across state lines for a legal abortion, premiered on HBO Max to critical acclaim.

Ferreira initially captivated audiences in her Vice series *How to Behave*, which explored modern etiquette and societal norms. Her work earned her a place on Time Magazine's list of the *Most Influential Teens* in 2016.

Beyond acting, Ferreira has cultivated strong creative collaborations, partnering with luxury brands such as YSL Beauty, H&M, Levi's, and Pandora.

Ferreira currently resides in Los Angeles.

JOHN LEGUIZAMO ("Bob Trevino")

Emmy Award winner John Leguizamo has appeared in over 100 films and countless television shows while establishing a career that defies categorization. With boundless and visceral creativity, his work in film, theatre, television, and literature covers a variety of genres, continually threatening to create a few of his own.

Leguizamo is the host and executive producer of MSNBC's hit travel show, *Leguizamo Does America*. The series brings viewers inside America's thriving Latino communities across the country, celebrating the history, culture, food and other contributions of Latinx people shaping America. The show was Peacock's most-viewed MSNBC original in over two years and is currently in production for the second season, shooting in Philadelphia, Raleigh, New Orleans, San Antonio, Phoenix and Denver.

Leguizamo will star in Apple Studio's upcoming drama series, *Firebug*, alongside Taron Egerton and Jurnee Smollett. Inspired by actual events, the series follows a troubled detective and an enigmatic arson investigator as they pursue the trails of two serial arsonists. Leguizamo will play 'Esposito,' a former policeman with bad habits and good instincts. Dennis Lehane created the series, which will begin shooting this summer.

Leguizamo stars as federal agent Gordon Rogers in the sci-fi-political mini-series *The Green Veil* which he produced alongside director Aram Rappaport. Highlighting oppression in 1950's America, the eight-part series follows Gordon Rogers, a federal agent who must complete a top-secret mission while navigating the struggles of his picture-perfect family. The series first premiered at the 2022 Tribeca Film Festival and will be available on Rappaport's new streaming platform, The Network, starting April 30, 2024.

Leguizamo stars in the upcoming independent film *Bob Trevino Likes It* opposite Barbie Ferreira. Written and directed by Tracie Laymon, the film is about a people-pleasing young woman searching for her estranged father online when she unexpectedly forms a close bond with a grieving, childless man with the same name as her father on Facebook. Inspired by a true story, the comedic drama recently

premiered at SXSW, winning the SXSW Grand Jury Award and the Audience Award in the Narrative Feature category.

Leguizamo hosts the upcoming PBS documentary series *American Historia: The Untold History of Latinos*, a project he co-created with director Ben De Jesus. Produced by his Latino-focused NGL Collective, the three-part series follows Leguizamo as he travels throughout Mexico and The United States to shed light on both the known and lesser-known stories of Latino history. Inspired by Leguizamo's multi-faceted style, each episode combines cultural travel segments and entertaining interstitials, unveiling passionate revelations about his favorite Latino figures.

Leguizamo will be seen in the upcoming thriller film *Tin Soldier opposite* Robert Di Niro, Jamie Foxx, and Rita Ora. Directed by Brad Furman, the film follows 'The Bokushi,' a leader who offers a program for US combat veterans seeking protection, purpose and a path forward. The government is concerned with the rapid rise of well-armed, highly trained, and devoted followers in the cult-like program.

He recently starred in the Amazon series *The Power*, based on the New York Times best-seller, alongside Toni Collette. He also starred in Showtime's five-part drama series *Waco: The Aftermath*, and in Mark Mylod's horror comedy *The Menu*, opposite Anya Taylor-Joy, Ralph Fiennes, and Nicholas Hoult.

Leguizamo garnered a Golden Globe nomination for Best Supporting Actor for his performance as a sensitive drag queen in *To Wong Foo Thanks for Everything, Julie Newmar*, was the recipient of the 2002 ALMA Special Achievement Award for Entertainer of the Year, and picked up ALMA Award nominations for his roles in *Moulin Rouge* (Best Supporting Actor) and *King of the Jungle* (Best Lead Actor).

Other film credits for him include *The Crash; 11:55; Porzingod; Stealing Cars; Sisters; Meadowland; Experimenter; American Ultra; Cymbeline; Fugly; John Wick; Chef;* the *Ice Age* franchise; *Ride Along; Underdogs; Walking with Dinosaurs 3D; The Counsellor; Kick-Ass-2; Fish N Chips: The Movie; Inocente; The Trip 2; The Hollow Point; The Infiltrator; One for the Money; The Lincoln Lawyer; Vanishing on 7th Street; Big Balls; Repo Men; The Ministers; Rage; Gamer; Nothing Like the Holidays; Miracle at St. Anna; Righteous Kill; The Happening; The Babysitters; The Take; Ice Age: The Meltdown; Land of the Dead; The Honeymooners; Zig Zag; Doctor Dolittle; Romeo + Juliet; The Fan; A Pyromaniac's Love Story; Super Mario Bros.; Night Owl; Poison; Die Hard 2; and Casualties of War.*

Leguizamo's TV work also includes *Bloodline; The Kill Point; ER; My Name is Ear; The Brothers Garcia; House of Buggin';* and *Miami Vice*.

Leguizamo garnered a Tony Award for his 2022 performance in *Latin History for Morons*, his one-man show where he delivers his take on 500 years of Latin History spanning the Aztec and Incan Empires, to World War II. *Latin History for Morons* was co-produced by Berkeley Rep and New York's Public Theatre.

In 1991, Leguizamo created his first off-Broadway sensation as the writer and performer of his one-man show *Mambo Mouth*, in which he portrayed seven different characters. He received Obie, Outer Critics

Circle and Vanguardia awards for this specific performance. Leguizamo went on to create his second off-Broadway one-man show *Spic-O-Rama*, which garnered a Dramatists' Guild Hull-Warriner Award for Best American Play, the Lucille Lortel Outstanding Achievement Award for Best Broadway Performance, the Theatre World Award for Outstanding New Talent, and the Drama Desk Award for Best Solo Performance.

Leguizamo's debut to Broadway was his one-man show, *Freak*, for which he received a Tony Award nomination for Best Play and Best Performance by a Leading Actor in a Play. Additional theater credits include, *Sexaholix... A Love Story*, which received a Tony nomination for Best Special Theatrical Performance; *A Midsummer Night's Dream, La Puta Vida Trilogy*; and *American Buffalo*. Leguizamo went on to film special presentations for HBO for his one-man shows including *Mambo Mouth*; *Spic-O-Rama*; *Freak*, for which he won a Emmy Award for Outstanding Performance in a Variety or Music Program; *Sexaholix... A Love Story*; and *Ghetto Klown*.

Leguizamo lengthened his lists of credits with his first literary project in 2006 with his memoir, *Pimps, Hos, Playa Hatas and All the Rest of My Hollywood Friends: My Life.* He also released *Ghetto Klown*, the graphic novel adaptation of his 2011 Drama Desk award winning one-man Broadway show in 2015.

Leguizamo currently resides in New York City with his wife and two children.

FRENCH STEWART ("Robert")

French Stewart got his start as a proud member of Justin Tanner's legendary Cast Theatre (Zombie Attack, Pot Mom, Party Mic, Teen Girl and Happy Time Xmas) and later joined the advisory board of Sacred Fools Theatre. Recent stage credits include: Tesla and Harvey (Laguna Playhouse) Matthew Modine Saves The Alpacas (Geffen Playhouse), Watson (Sacred Fools Theater Company), Voice Lessons (with Laurie Metcalf) Off Broadway at Theatre Row and most recently the Steppenwolf Theater in Chicago. He also appeared as Buster Keaton in Stoneface at The Pasadena Playhouse.

On screen, Mr. Stewart, is best known for his work on the classic TV series, Third Rock From The Sun. He has appeared in countless television shows including some recurring spots on The Middle, Deadly Class, NCIS, Secrets & Lies, Will Trent and as Chef Rudy on Chuck Lorre's hit comedy, MOM just to name a few...

Film credits include: Inspector Gadget 2, Stargate, Queen Bees, The Flock, Leaving Las Vegas, cult favorite Love Stinks with Bridgette Wilson and most recently, Bob Trevino Likes It.

RACHEL BAY JONES ("Jeanie")

Emmy, Tony and Grammy Award winning actress Rachel Bay Jones currently stars in Chuck Lorre's "Georgie & Mandy's First Marriage," which premiered this past fall on CBS. She can next be seen starring in the SXSW Grand Jury prize-winning indie film "Bob Trevino Likes It," set to be released in theatres this March from Roadside Attractions. Jones is best known for originating the role of 'Heidi Hansen' in the

Original Broadway Cast of Dear Evan Hansen, and received a Tony Award, Emmy Award, Grammy Award, Lucille Lortel Award and Drama League Nomination for her performance.

Jones' additional Broadway credits include "Pippin," "Hair" and "Women on the Verge of a Nervous Breakdown." Her Off-Broadway and Regional/National Tour credits include "Next To Normal" (Kennedy Center), "Dear Evan Hansen" at Second Stage (Drama Desk Nomination), "First Daughter Suite" at The Public Theater, "Hello Again," "A Christmas Story," "Sylvia" and "The King and I." In film, Jones has starred in "Ben Is Back" opposite Julia Roberts and in "Critical Thinking," directed by and opposite John Leguizamo, and will soon be seen in the independent film "Rise & Shine."

On television, Jones has appeared on NBC's "Law & Order: SVU," ABC's "Grey's Anatomy," "The Family," and the FX series "Louie." She also had recurring roles on "Young Sheldon," "The Good Doctor," "The United States of Al," "Panic," "Why Women Kill," "Modern Family" and "God Friended Me."

LOLO SPENCER ("Daphne")

Lauren "Lolo" Spencer co-stars alongside Barbie Ferreira in BOB TREVINO LIKES IT, which won both the Narrative Feature Jury Award and the Audience Award at SXSW in 2024. She first broke out with her Indie Spirit Award nomination for "Best Supporting Female" in GIVE ME LIBERTY in 2020 after its Sundance premiere and would go on to play fan favorite series regular "Jocelyn" on the first two seasons of THE SEX LIVES OF COLLEGE GIRLS. One of InStyle's 50 Women Making the World a Better Place in 2021, Lolo is an ambulatory wheelchair user due to a neuromuscular mobility disability and became a powerful voice in disability advocacy, winning the Christopher Reeve Acting Scholarship after her Sundance debut. In 2023 she released her first book, Access Your Drive and Enjoy the Ride, and she voices "Jazzy" on Disney Jr's animated series FIREBUDS.

ABOUT THE FILMMAKERS

TRACIE LAYMON | WRITER/DIRECTOR/PRODUCER

Tracie Laymon is the writer/director of BOB TREVINO LIKES IT, which premiered at SXSW '24 where it won both the SXSW Grand Jury Award for Best Narrative Feature and the SXSW Audience Award. Starring John Leguizamo, Barbie Ferreira, and French Stewart, the film was recently acquired by Roadside Attractions. It's set to release in theaters March 21, 2025.

A Texas-native, Laymon spent some of her formative teen years in Russia before returning to the States for college, where she began directing short films. She has been named to IFC's list of emerging "Icons" and film innovators. Tracie is a fierce advocate for the inclusion and representation of all genders as well as people with disabilities in front of and behind the camera. As a filmmaker, her goal is to amplify

diverse perspectives through underdog stories—stories about reluctant heroes who find unexpected ways to succeed in the face of adversity.

SEAN MULLIN | PRODUCER

Sean Mullin is an award-winning filmmaker and screenwriter. His critically-acclaimed feature film debut as a writer/director – *Amira & Sam* – won the top prize at numerous festivals and was distributed theatrically by Drafthouse Films in 2015.

His documentary debut as a writer/director – *Kings of Beer* – is about the world's most intense brewmaster competition and it was released in theaters in 2019. His documentary – *It Ain't Over* – about baseball legend and American Icon, Yogi Berra, received a nationwide theatrical release by Sony Pictures Classics in 2023. It was nominated for two Critics Choice Awards and a Writers Guild Award. His most recent documentary – *Brothers* – is an unprecedented look inside the most unique culture of any Division I Athletic Team in America – the West Point Army Rugby Team – as they fight to defend their 2022 National Championship.

As a producer, Sean produced *Allegiance* (Alameda) and *Semper Fi* (Lionsgate) – both of which received theatrical releases. Most recently, Sean produced *Bob Trevino Likes It* – which won the Jury Award and the Audience Award at the 2024 SXSW Film Festival and will be released theatrically by Roadside Attractions in early 2025.

Prior to his filmmaking career, Sean served in the military. He was stationed in Germany as an army officer and finished his time as a Captain in the New York Army National Guard – where he was a first responder on September 11th, 2001. For several months, he spent his days working as the Officer in Charge of the soldiers stationed at Ground Zero – and his nights performing stand-up comedy.

Sean holds an MFA from *Columbia University* and a B.S. from *The United States Military Academy at West Point*. He is a member of the Writers Guild of America (WGA) and the Producers Guild of America (PGA). Sean is represented by UTA. He is the co-founder of Five By Eight Productions and he's a guest lecturer at AFI, USC and West Point.

EDGAR ROSA | PRODUCER

Edgar Lacey Rosa is a multi-racial line producer from Des Moines, Iowa. Growing up in theater and music were the foundation of his artistic endeavors before the film industry. He received his BA in Film Production at Emerson College in 2012 before moving to Los Angeles to pursue his Masters in Producing at the AFI Conservatory. Edgar began to work professionally in digital media during the rise of YouTube and social media influencers/creators. Within the past few years, he has lent his services on commercials, TV series, and feature films across the United States and abroad. These jobs have allowed him to build an impressive list of collaborators in a relatively short amount of time. Outside of work, Edgar spends his time educating himself on social justice, volunteering, redesigning his apartment, and wondering why they haven't arrested the murderers of innocent black, indigenous, and other persons of color from the last 400 years+ in American history. 2025 brings new opportunities as Edgar, under his

Purple Intuition banner with partner Marie Alyse Rodriguez, has several projects on the horizon that will allow him to continue bringing diverse stories to the screen while ensuring equity of the crew behind the camera. This is planned with time off to focus on mental and physical well-being. He is grateful to those who align with the balance of these goals.

FELIPE DIEPPA | PRODUCER

Felipe Dieppa is an award-winning producer, writer and director, who began his career as a child actor, originating the voice of "Diego" on Nickelodeon's Dora the Explorer. He also starred alongside Steve Carell and Juliette Binoche in Dan in Real Life (2007). As a filmmaker, Dieppa has produced or executive produced over a dozen feature films and shorts, with his features premiering at distinguished festivals like Sundance, SXSW, the Los Angeles Film Festival, and Tribeca. Notable works include executive producing Charlie Kaufman's short film "Jackals & Fireflies" (2023), and producing One Percent More Humid (2017), In Like Flynn (2018), and Operator (2016). He is currently a founding board-member of the Louisville Film Office, a Kentucky-based non-profit dedicated to nurturing the State's burgeoning film industry.

CARL EFFENSON | EXECUTIVE PRODUCER

Carl Effenson is a distinguished film producer best known for his work on Mudbound, which earned four Academy Award nominations and was named Movie of the Year by both The Washington Post and LA Times. He also served as executive producer on Bob Trevino Likes It, which won both the Grand Jury Prize and Audience Award at SXSW 2024.

Effenson's film Mending the Line, starring Brian Cox, was released globally by Sony and became Netflix's #1 film following its 2023 theatrical debut. Most recently, he produced Maybe We Should, an inspiring family drama about a therapy center for children with special needs, starring Heather Graham, Lil Rel Howery, and Kevin Nealon.

Effenson also produced Hide Away, which won the Grand Jury Prize for Cinematography at SXSW, and Burying the Ex, directed by Joe Dante, which premiered at the Venice Film Festival.

Effenson's diverse body of work underscores his dedication to producing impactful films that resonate with audiences and critics alike.

KIRK D'AMICO | EXECUTIVE PRODUCER

Award-winning producer Kirk D'Amico founded Myriad Pictures in 1998 and has positioned the company as a leading sales and distribution home for diverse films and emerging talent. D'Amico has produced or executive produced over 60 films and Myriad has distributed hundreds of films worldwide. The current release slate includes Luke Sparke's BRING HIM TO ME – opening in February 2024 and starring Barry Pepper, Sam Neill, and Rachel Griffiths; THE PRANK starring Rita Moreno; and THE THROWBACK starring Justina Machado and Will Sasso and opening in March 2024.D'Amico most

In 2010, D'Amico also co-founded Canadian distributor and production company Photon Films. Based in Toronto, Photon has released a diverse slate of bold films in Canada both theatrically and across all platforms. Notable films include THE ETERNAL DAUGHTER starring Tilda Swinton, SOUND OF METAL starring Riz Ahmed, and THE HATING GAME starring Lucy Hale.

Ophthalmologist married to Rose Stewart Holdren (for 40 years), we are both EP for BTLI (BOB TREVINO LIKES IT), and are chosen family with writer/director Tracie Laymon. Along with 2 of our daughters (Karli Holdren & Lindsey Holdren, who have both studied film in college), we have all worked with Tracie before on other projects and have even had a bunch of writer's retreats and table reads at our home. More recently, it has been very enjoyable and rewarding to help Tracie out with her projects, such as reviewing scripts, casting, soundtracks, helping creating legal entities, getting funding, and we even got to hang out and help out on set. Even got to be a fun cameo appearance background extra! Also, another interesting twist to all this is the interesting development that a week or so after we returned from the filming in Louisville, I was then officially diagnosed with ALS, which is the same rare condition that actress Lauren "Lolo" Spencer has in real life. This would also be the condition that her character "Daphne" has to deal with in BTLI. I realize that Tracie feels that representation of people with disabilities is very important to her. I sure appreciate her concern for folks with conditions, and I can sure
